## ANCA COMMANDER TO STEP DOWN FOR PENTAGON ASSIGNMENT

**ANNISTON ARMY DEPOT, Ala. (July 10, 2012)** - Lt.Col. Willie J. Flucker, Jr., commander of Anniston Chemical Activity (ANCA), relinquishes his command at a formal ceremony Thursday morning. Lt.Col. became the ninth and final ANCA commander two years ago. A Soldier for more than 28 years, Lt.Col. Flucker will next report to The Pentagon where he will become the Military Assistant to the Undersecretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness.

The ANCA Civilian Deputy, Jesse E. Brown, III, will be installed as the ANCA Civilian Executive In Charge by Don Barclay, Acting Director, U.S. Army Chemical Materials Agency, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md. Since all of the chemical munitions at Anniston Army Depot haven safely demilitarized, it will be Brown's mission to lead the ANCA civilian team through the final inspections and cleaning of the storage igloos for return to Anniston Army Depot. Additionally, all of ANCA's vehicles, equipment, and facilities need to be prepared for issue to other organizations or disposal. Simultaneously, Brown will manage a work force Reduction in Force. Managers will assist employees who want to continue their Federal careers, they will help others who will be transitioning to the private sector, and other employees will be counseled as they prepare for retirement.
