UMCDF Operations

- Safety is number one at UMCDF: employees have worked 417 days since the last lost-workday accident (Oct. 22, 2005).
- The disposal facility surpassed 50 percent destruction for GB-M55 rockets, Dec. 10.
- Also Dec. 10, chemical agent destruction exceeded 250 tons.
