In 1985, Congress mandated the U.S. Army destroy its stockpile of chemical agents and munitions. In 1997, the United States ratified the Chemical Weapons Convention, a treaty that requires all member states to destroy their chemical weapons and production facilities.

The Anniston Chemical Activity (ANCA) is responsible for all aspects of the chemical munitions mission at Anniston Army Depot. ANCA employees ensure the munitions are safely stored. They also move the munitions to the Anniston Chemical Agent Disposal Facility (ANCDF). The ANCDF was built to safely destroy the munitions and chemical warfare materiel. Disposal operations began in 2003. ANCDF employees have processed all nerve agent GB munitions. The facility will close once all of the nerve agent VX munitions and mustard agent munitions have been processed.

The Anniston Chemical Demilitarization Community Outreach Office provides the public with timely information about ANCA, activities at the ANCDF, the chemical weapons disposal program, associated programs and activities and disposal processes.
