## Pueblo Chemical Depot

### Pueblo Chemical Depot Logo

Throughout the years and the various missions, the name of the Pueblo, Colo., depot has changed. In April 2006, depot employees submitted art work for consideration for a new depot logo. The entire work force as well as a group of depot retirees voted on one that portrayed the depot's past, present and future missions. The final selection came in June 2006.

The colors, cobalt blue and yellow gold are representative of the U.S. Army Chemical Corps.

"Pueblo Depot" is representative of the installation throughout its history.

"1942" is the date of establishment.

"Safety" and "Service" captures the continued depot historical mission.

The hawk represents native depot wildlife, the present and future mission of the environmental programs and was the name of one of the missile systems supplied by the depot during its missile mission in the 1950's and 60's.

The mountain has been a longtime logo element for the depot representing Pike's Peak.

The setting sun is portrayed to the South of Pike's Peak as seen from Pueblo.

The branch insignia of both the U.S. Army Chemical Corps and Ordnance Corps represent the depot's command structure through its history as both an ordnance and a chemical depot.

The Pershing Missile in the center represents one of the most prominent missions of the depot..
