Draft reports indicate the Deseret Chemical Depot (DCD) and the Tooele Chemical Agent Disposal Facility (TOCDF) performed well during a recent Chemical Surety Inspection.

Inspectors with the Department of the Army Inspector General (DAIG) spent two weeks on site in November, looking at everything related to the chemical surety mission, including safety, security and records management. According to preliminary inspection results, both DCD and TOCDF performed very well. In fact, TOCDF had significant reductions in the number of noted deficiencies and factors compared to the previous DAIG inspection.

"The successful completion of this inspection is a direct result of the professionalism and teamwork demonstrated by the entire workforce of DCD and TOCDF," said Col. Gerald Gladney, DCD Commander.
